



# MADAGASCAR

*Explore the Unique Heritage of this Enchanting Land!*

**October 4-19, 2014**

We invite you to join us as we explore the natural heritage and unique flora and wildlife of Madagascar in 2014! This 16-day expedition offers travel enthusiasts an exceptional opportunity to become acquainted with the flora and fauna of Madagascar.

Madagascar is the fourth largest island in the world, isolated from the African continent for 30 million years. It is home to at least 12,000 plants—a high percentage that are unique to the country. Ninety-five percent of the lemurs and reptiles, 80 percent of the flowering plants, 98 percent of the palms, and more than 100 birds are found nowhere else.

Leading this tour will be **Herilala Jonah**, a superb Madagascar naturalist. Representing the Society will be staff member **John Burns**.

The itinerary includes:

- **Antananarivo & the Lemur Park.** Visit the capital city of Madagascar and this private reserve established in 2001 for lemur education and conservation.

- **Perinet Reserve**, in the eastern rain forests. Look for the largest of the lemurs, the indri, noted for its ear-shattering cries and agility in traveling through the rain forest canopy. Explore the moist forest with trees covered in epiphytes, ferns, and large lianas with bamboo below.

- **Berenty Reserve**, an internationally acclaimed wildlife reserve in the semi-arid south. Enjoy the unique spiny desert plus a profusion of ring-tailed lemurs, sifakas, lepi-lemurs, and flying foxes.

- **Reserve de Nahampoana**, an excellent botanical reserve near Fort Dauphin.

- **Isalo National Park**, an extraordinary landscape in the southwest with arid sandstone ridges sculpted by wind and water, with lemurs and endemic plants.

We hope you will join us for this adventure, and discover the magnificence of Madagascar in 2014!





## Itinerary

### Days 1/3 USA to Paris & Madagascar

Fly to Paris October 4. Depart October 5 on Air Madagascar for Antananarivo, arrive the next morning. A short drive will bring us into "Tana," a captivating city of hills with the architectural ambiance of the French countryside and beauty of the Malagasy people. Enjoy a city tour today and visit to the private Lemur Park just west of Tana, which was established in 2001 as a conservation project. Welcome dinner. *Royal Palissandre Hotel*. B,L,D

### Day 4 Perinet

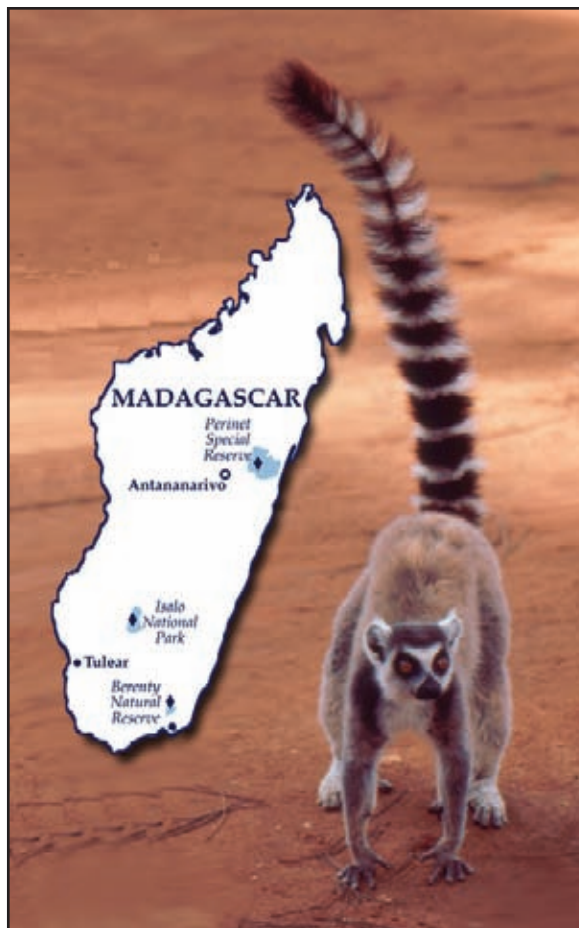
This morning, we will descend from an elevation of 4,500 feet on the central plateau down the steep eastern escarpment to the moist montane rain forest and farms near Perinet. *Vakona Lodge (3 nights)*, between Perinet Reserve and Mantadia National Park. B,L,D

### Day 5 Perinet & Mantadia National Park

This morning, we will go to Mantadia National Park, home to the most colorful lemur in Madagascar, the diademed sifaka, as well as the most aggressive lemur, the black and white ruffed lemur. This park is also rich in plants found nowhere else in the world. It is the right place to find out more about the lianas and epiphytes such as orchids. We will try to see *Tambourissa*, a special tree most people use for house construction. We will also look for the world's smallest primate, the mouse lemur, plus small tree frogs and tiny chameleons. B,L,D

### Day 6 Perinet

Morning expedition in the Analamazaotra National Park. This forest has a high rate of plant endemism. It is the only place to see a rare orchid that grows on palms. Also see *Pandanus*, with large green leaves where some small frogs hide, and *Cyathea*, tree ferns with large fronds. As we walk the wooded ridges, shady creek bottoms, and fern-edged lakes of Perinet, we will



also look for some of the unique birds of Madagascar, including vangas, cuckoo-rollers, and sunbirds, and the world's largest lemur, the indri, well-known for its loud, haunting call. B,L,D

### Day 7 Perinet & Tana

As we leave the lush beauty of Perinet, the rain forest immediately gives way to heavily logged hills, camps for charcoal production, and rugged red gullies swirling with muddy torrents. We will also see forests planted to generate wood for future charcoal production. *Royal Palissandre Hotel*. B,L,D

### Day 8 Tana, Fort Dauphin & Berenty

This morning, we will fly to picturesque Fort Dauphin in southeast Madagascar and then drive to Berenty past a reserve

which protects the world's only three-cornered palm. The bizarre woody and thorny plants of the spiny desert are reminiscent of the Sonoran Desert of the American Southwest, but composed primarily of species unique to Madagascar.

Berenty is a superb wildlife reserve which has attracted considerable international attention. Here, the de Heaulme family established a reserve on the bank of the Mandrare River to protect the woods and their captivating inhabitants, the lemurs. We will have simple accommodations at *Berenty Lodge (2 nights)*. B,L,D

### Days 9/10

#### Berenty Reserve

We will wake at dawn to begin to enjoy the lemurs antics and early chorus of birdlife. Just ahead may be a half dozen ring-tailed lemurs. Nearby sifakas may cavort in a tree while soft gray lepilemurs may peer down at us from their daytime roosts. Hundreds of

flying foxes may cling just under the forest canopy. The spiny forest supports crested couas, hoopoes, bushlarks, cisticolas, doves, and other bird species. We will explore the spiny forest to discover plants endemic to the south of Madagascar and lemurs which are found in the spiny forest. Return to Fort Dauphin and the *Croix de Sud Hotel*. B,L,D



## Society Representative

Representing the Society on the Madagascar Expedition will be John Burns. John has an M.S. from Antioch New England Graduate School and has traveled extensively through the U.S, Canada, Europe, and South America, including the Society's recent trip to Ecuador and the Galapagos Islands, studying the ecology of the regions he has visited. He is the Coordinator of the Society's Plant Conservation Volunteer Program and looks forward to sharing his enthusiasm and knowledge of tropical plants and wildlife with you.





### Day 11 Fort Dauphin

Today we will explore the botanical garden of Reserve de Nahampoana, 7 km east of Fort Dauphin. This well maintained garden, formerly named Garden of Acclimatisation, covers an area of 50 hectares. Good hiking trails wind through vegetation typical of the east and south of Madagascar. If the Air Mad flight schedule requires it, we will fly to Tana for overnight. In Tana, we would visit the Botanical Gardens and Zoo. *Hotel Croix du Sud* or *Royal Palissandre*. B,L,D

### Day 12 To Tulear & Isalo National Park

This morning, we will fly to Tulear in the southwest. We will then drive 200 km inland to Parc National de L'Isalo, situated on a sandstone massif, and heavily eroded by wind and water into fascinating formations. *Hotel Relais de la Reine* (2 nights). B,L,D

### Day 13 Isalo National Park

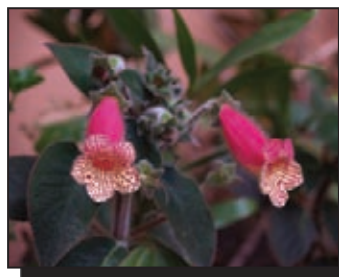
Today, we will spend the whole day in Isalo National Park. It is famous for its canyons and sclerophyllous woodland. Along the stream from the canyon, we will look for lemurs. On the way to the natural pool, we will see elephant's foot *Pachypodium rosulatum* with a beautiful yellow flower, and many rare endemic plants. B,L,D

### Days 14 Isalo to Tulear

We will drive back to Tulear and enjoy an afternoon at the Arboretum of Antsohay. This botanical garden specializes in the flora of Southwest Madagascar. Almost 900 species of plants (90% of the collection) is endemic to the region and 80% have medicinal properties. See baobabs which are endemic to Madagascar. *Victory Hotel*. B,L,D

### Days 15/16 Tana & USA

Today we will fly to Tana. Take the late evening flight to Paris arriving on the morning of October 19th. Then have connecting flights back to the USA. B,L/-

### Costs & Conditions (continued)

**Expedition Fee:** \$3,995 pp twin share for 16 days (land only); \$1,395 round trip air fare Paris to Madagascar plus \$1,395 air fare for in-country flights. Single supplement is \$1,295.

**What to Expect:** An exceptional exploration of superb nature reserves of Madagascar and its cultural heritage, led by an excellent naturalist. Travel by coach and vans, with daily outings of one to two miles on foot at a leisurely pace suitable for observation and discovery. Typically, temperatures are in the 70's to 80's in Madagascar with moderate humidity.

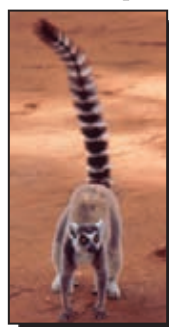
Most of our time is spent near sea level, though Antananarivo is at 4,500 feet and it can be in the 50's. If you have any questions, please consult your physician. This expedition will be an extraordinary experience for adventurous travelers in good health who can enjoy some modest accommodations and bumpy dirt roads for the chance to explore outstanding environments in remote areas of the country.

**Please note: flight schedule and itinerary changes may occur over which there is no control.** (No smoking in vehicles, during lectures, or meals.)

**Expedition Fee Includes:** Land transportation as described; group airport transfers; accommodations twin share; meals in Madagascar; tips to local guides; entrance fees; baggage handling; leadership, coordination, administration.

**Expedition Fee Does Not Include:** International or in-tour air fare (quoted separately) gratuity to expedition leader; personal items such as laundry, phone calls, alcoholic beverages, snacks, bottled water, passport, excess baggage charges, personal insurance; or foreign airport departure tax.

**Accommodations:** Are in a first class hotel in Antananarivo. At Berenty, Isalo, and Perinet, we will stay in country-style lodges with private facilities. A couple are simple but "best available" and certainly part of the adventure of travel in Madagascar. All singles may have to be paired with a roommate in



remote areas. If you do not have a roommate, you must pay the single supplement of \$1,295.

**Air Fare & Airline Ticketing:** Air fare quoted is based on a group fare from Paris to Madagascar, round trip, plus in-tour flights. All air bookings, ticketing,

and invoicing will be handled by Betchart Expeditions Inc. AIR FARES ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE AND FUEL SURCHARGE.
